



EBLI Consulting Guidelines

Onsite consulting is **mandatory** as a follow up to select EBLI trainings. EBLI is a process that is carried out over time and a paradigm shift in delivering literacy instruction, which makes onsite consulting a key component to ensure high quality instruction in the classroom. Once trainees complete EBLI training, a certified EBLI consultant travels on-site to work with them in the classroom. Below is a list of onsite consulting guidelines and recommendations.

Requirements

- EBLI requires 3 consulting days for every 6 trainees (3 consulting days for 6 trainees, 6 consulting days for 7-12 trainees, 9 consulting days for 13-18 trainees, etc.).
- Several trainees receive consulting per day; days are spread throughout the year.
- On average, an EBLI consultant works in 4-6 classrooms a day.

Recommendations

- Plan to allow time for debriefing and Q&A at the end of class periods.
- As schools train more people, consulting focuses more on new trainees, but previously trained teachers can observe and should take part in debriefing.
- Schools often arrange for substitutes so more teachers can observe.

Program Flexibility

The number of consulting days and arrangement are often determined on a case-by-case basis depending on the number of trainees and the delivery model for EBLI instruction that clients use. For more information, contact EBLI directly.
